
### **Hats Off to the Birthday Dog**

The children get to learn about pet care and respect for animal space as the club member reads to them. This is always a teaching opportunity.

Display boxes were artfully filled with educational information. We thanks Jeanne Epp for 2 displays. One on heart worm shows a worm infected real on loan from the Nicollet Vet Clinic. Another focuses on care of teeth with photos of a tooth surgery, and the resulting pieces of the tooth.

Sharon Olson presented 2 boxes as well. One is filled with KCKC information on activities you can do with your dog. The second is filled with grooming information. It contains grooming tools and actual toe nails that are painfully long. Sharon was kind enough to bring a huge pelt of felted fur that had to be shaved from a dog.
